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1SEC. 2. REPORT ON ENTREPRENEURSHIP CHALLENGES OF2ENTREPRENEURS WITH DISABILITIES.

3 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section, the terms "Ad4 ministration" and "Administrator" mean the Small Busi5 ness Administration and the Administrator thereof, re6 spectively.

7 (b) REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after the date
8 of enactment of this Act, the Administrator shall submit
9 to Congress a report on the challenges that entrepreneurs
10 with a disability encounter with starting and operating a
11 business, including—

12 (1) an assessment of the challenges and needs13 of entrepreneurs with a disability;

14 (2) a description of the resources and support
15 that the Administration provides to entrepreneurs
16 with a disability;

(3) a description of outreach to entrepreneurs
with a disability by the Administration, including by
district and regional offices of the Administration,
small business development centers (as defined in
section 3(t) of the Small Business Act (15 U.S.C.
632(t))), and women's business centers (as defined
in section 29(a) of such Act (15 U.S.C. 656(a)));

(4) a description of any joint efforts between offices of the Administration or between the Administration and other Federal agencies to advance the

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goal of supporting the economic success of entre-1 2 preneurs with a disability; 3 (5) a discussion of any deficiencies in the re-4 sources and support described under paragraph (2); 5 (6) a description of the use of, and access to, 6 resources of the Administration by entrepreneurs 7 with a disability; and 8 (7) any recommendations for legislative actions 9 that are necessary to address the challenges or needs 10 of entrepreneurs with a disability that are identified 11 in the report. 12 (c) COMPLIANCE WITH CUTGO.—No additional 13 amounts are authorized to be appropriated to carry out 14 this Act.
